Hello and happy New Year!

The NPRC is starting off the year with important news for those in substance abuse and related fields.

First, the Synthetic Drug Control Act, which bans more than 30 synthetic drugs, including “Bath Salts” and “Spice”, passed the U.S. House of Representatives and is currently being considered by the U.S. Senate. Second, pharmaceutical companies, in response to the FDA planned 2014 phase-out of pain relief products combined with acetaminophine, are currently developing new extended-release formulations of hydrocodone, called zohydro and TD Hydrocodone. These single drug products are being developed

with higher dosages of hydrocodone than current combination prescription pain relief products on the market. The exclusion of acetaminophen is good news for those in need of pain relief who are concerned about liver damage. However, because of the high level of hydrocodone, many are worried about the potential for abuse. This topic is certainly something to keep an eye on in the news and warrants continued efforts to partner with parents, healthcare providers, educators, law enforcement and others in Nevada communities to reduce all prescription drug abuse.
