Welcome!

Poster presentations can be as effective as full conference presentations in sharing valuable information. Such was the case during the SALIS Conference in Seattle last May, when Diane van Abbe, Information Coordinator at the Ontario tobacco Research Unit at the University of Toronto Centre for Addiction and Mental Health, presented a poster entitled: "Reaching Out: Filling the Gaps by Developing and Disseminating Knowledge Exchange Products." According to the Canadian Health Services Research Foundation, Knowledge Exchange is "The collaborative problem-solving between researchers and decision makers that happens through linkage and exchange."

Knowledge Exchange products can enhance capacity, help create better programs, and provide better outcomes by translating knowledge for specific audiences, creating a shared understanding of research evidence, and creating that much needed link between research and practice. Knowledge Exchange requires knowing your audience, whether they be researchers, policy makers, treatment and prevention providers, or the general public. It also means knowing their needs, that

their needs can change, and that all needs cannot be met with one product. What does this mean for providers of products and services? If the purpose is to help a specific audience, both the audience and researchers must be engaged, and a process used that allows people to: "Ask about the needs of stakeholders; identify gaps in knowledge; maintain credibility by rigor and review; decide on a mode of dissemination; and include an evaluation plan." That way, through Knowledge Exchange, products and services are created for the intended audience or purpose, are user friendly and accessible, have been evaluated and are credible, and evolve to meet changing needs and roles of stakeholders.

This poster session by a colleague from neighboring Canada demonstrated a system similar to the national infrastructure of "Technology Transfer" used in prevention and treatment fields through the Addiction Technology Transfer Centers and the Centers for the Application of Prevention Technologies and for the coalition infrastructure that has been created throughout Nevada. Since information dissemination is an integral part of this process, we wanted to share it as validation for the work all of you do that seems to be the standard in other parts of the world.
