Library Report

As one can tell from the Library Materials Update, the NPRC library collection is growing. We constantly add new books, videos, journals, and kits to the collection so we can better serve everyone.

Many of the new resources added in May have a call number that includes BADA VF. This may cause one to ask, "What is this mysterious VF, and why have they got so many of them?" VF stands for Vertical File. Essentially, it is a large filing cabinet in the reference library where items of a certain nature are kept. They include pamphlets, newspaper articles, fact sheets, and brochures. Some items in the vertical file are older versions of current pamphlets, others are no longer available to order nationally.

So why do we add these to our collection? We keep these items to have a record of the things that have been produced in the past, and as a reference for people who remember the older materials. These materials can be valuable for historic purposes and may be the only copy of an item available in the city, state, or even country.

The vertical file is a great resource with a lot of information. If you are interested in seeing what it is about, stop by and we will be happy to show it and the rest of the collection to you.
