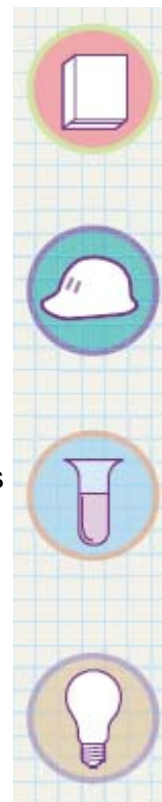

Bulk Materials Update

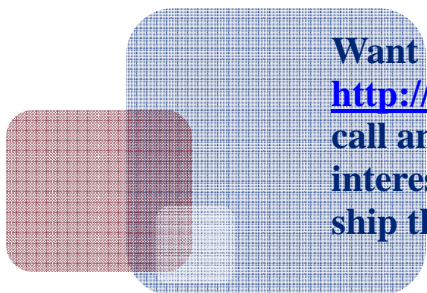
